NOTICE OF RACE

1.VENUE

The WaterFront Center, 1 West End Ave, Oyster Bay, NY 11771.

The racing area will be the waters near Red Bell 32A in Long Island Sound, Cold Spring Harbor and Oyster Bay Harbor.

2.RULES

- 2.1** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* and the I420 Class Rules.
- 2.2** Special Procedures for Appendix P will be in effect. Rule 42 may be enforced.
- 2.3** The following US prescriptions will apply: Appendix R, and the prescriptions to rules 40, 67, 76.1.

3. ADVERTISING AND BOW NUMBER

Boats may be required to display bow numbers and/or advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority.

4.EVENTS FORMAT

The event shall consist of up to 10 scheduled races on the two official days of the regatta.

6.ELIGIBILITY

- 6.1** The championships is open to all boats of the International 420 Class.
- 6.2** All sailors must be current members of US Sailing (www.ussailing.org) and the US I-420 Class Association (www.USI420.org).

7.REGISTRATION

7.1 Competitors shall register on-line via Regatta Network's Website
www.regattanetwork.com

7.2 Entry fee per boat: \$165.

7.3 Entry fee include three days of racing, three sandwich lunch buffets, bottled water, fruit and snacks

9 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available for each competitor and Team Leader at registration.

10.SAFETY REGULATIONS

Competitors shall wear a USCG approved lifejacket that is 100% dependent on foam for flotation and the appropriate size for the sailor, at all times while on the water, except for brief periods while adding or removing clothing. This changes rule 40.

11.COURSES

Depending on class size and weather conditions, the courses sailed will be at the discretion of the PRO.

12.SCORING

12.1 The Low Point Scoring System, Appendix A2, shall be used except as modified below.

12.2.1 A minimum of 3 races must be completed to constitute a regatta.

12.2.2 There shall be one (1) throw out when five (5) or more races are sailed.

13.PRIZES

13.1 The first three crews Overall shall receive an award.

13.2 The first all-female crew shall receive an award.

13.3 The prizes will be given to both members of crew.

14.COACH BOAT AND SUPPORT PERSONAL

All support boats shall act as rescue boats in case of need (more details in Sailing

Instructions).

15.DISCLAIMER of LIABILITY AND INSURANCE

Competitors participate in the Regatta at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority shall not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during or after the event. Each competitor shall have valid third party insurance with a minimum coverage of \$1,000,000.

Each participant warrants the suitability of his or her boat for the event.

16.RIGHTS TO USE NAMES & LIKENESSES

By participating in the regatta competitors automatically grant to the International 420 Class Association and to the Organizing Authority and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
