NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- **1.1** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- **1.2** National prescriptions will apply.
- **1.3** RRS Appendix P, *Special Procedures for Rule 42*, will apply.
- **1.4** For the medal race, the sailing instructions of Addendum Q take precedence over any conflicting instructions.
- **1.5** If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 ADVERTISING

Advertising will be restricted to ISAF Regulation 20.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the following class(es):

- **3.2** For each class, the boys, girls and open will race together in one fleet.
- **3.3** All Singaporean participants are required to have at least an SSF Opti-Racer certification or a Dinghy Proficiency Level 1 for single-handed dinghy sailors. Double-handed sailors will require at least a Dinghy Proficiency Level 2. Windsurfers will require at least a Windsurfing Proficiency Level 1.
- **3.4** A minimum of 6 entries in each class is required to form an event. If the minimum number of entries is not received for any particular class, the decision to allow the event to be included will be at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
- **3.5** For the Optimist class, it is the responsibility of the competitors to compete in the correct fleet. No ranking points will be awarded to a competitor who races in the wrong fleet.

4 FEES

5 COMPETITION FORMAT

5.1 The regatta will consist of an opening series and a medal race for all events with 20 or more entries. For events with less than 20 entries, the regatta will be a single series.

5.2 For the opening series and the single series, 12 races are scheduled. A minimum of 10 races are required to be completed to constitute an opening series for an event in order for the top 10 finishers to advance to the medal race. On the last day, there will be a Final Race for each event for sailors who did not qualify for the medal races.

- 6.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 1100h.
- 6.4 Optimist sailors listed in the SingaporeSailing Optimist Gold Fleet ranking list (as of 1 Mar 2018) shall sail as one fleet for the entire event. All other sailors in the national ranking shall sail in the Optimist Silver Fleet. International entrants who are not on the national ranking will be allocated to either the Gold or Silver Fleet at the Organising Authority discretion based upon their own national ranking and previous result history.

8 VENUE

- 8.1 Attachment 1 shows the location of the regatta centre.
- **8.2** Attachment 2 shows the location of the racing areas.

9 THE COURSES

9.1 The diagrams in Attachment 3, 4 & 5 show the course, including the approximate angles between legs, the otder in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

10 PENALTY SYSTEM

- **10.1** For the 29er and Nacra 15 class, rule 44.1 and P2.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- **10.2** Decisions of the international jury will be final as provided in rule 70.5.

11 SCORING Regatta Scoring System

- 11.1 At least 3 races are required to be completed to constitute a regatta.
- **11.3** (a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When 5 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. However, the score from the Medal Race, if any, will not be excluded.
 - (c) In medal races, a boat's score shall be double the number of points specified in RRS Appendix A4.1, and the score for that race shall not be excluded from the series score.
 - (d) Ties in the series score between boats with different medal race point scores shall be broken in favour of the boat that scored better in the medal race. This changes RRS Appendix A8.
 - (e) The boats assigned to compete in the medal race will be ranked highest in their fleet, except boats disqualified from the medal race under RRS 5 or RRS 69.
 - (f) A boat assigned to compete in the medal race shall make a genuine effort to start, sail the course and finish. A breach of this paragraph shall not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a). The penalty for a breach of this paragraph will be ranking the boat 10th in the regatta. If there are two such boats, they will be ranked 9th and 10th, in order of their opening-series ranks, and so on. This changes RRS A2.

12 SUPPORT BOATS

Support boat regulation shall apply. A copy of the regulation will be posted on the official notice board.

13 BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while they are in the boat park.

14 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

- 18.1 By participating in an event, competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority, their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 18.2 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment and positioning equipment as specified by the Organising Authority.








Directions from Changi Airport to National Sailing Centre:


- 1) Head North on Airport Blvd

- 6) Turn into service road




Course diagrams for all classes except Optimists
